- Art. 11th Voted to pay a Bounty of fifteen cents to all persons belonging to town for each brow killed in said town, or on land belonging to individuals of said town, between the first day of May and the first day of November of the present year said Bounty to be paid by the Selectmen satisfactory proof being given that they are entitled to the same.
- Art. 12th Voted to instruct the Committee chosen to defend the suit brought by the first Parish against said town to ascertain on what conditions said suit can be adjusted and report.
- Art. 13th Voted that the same Committee be instructed to investigate the subject referred to in this article and settle the same if in their opinion it will be for the interest of the Town.
- Art. 14th Voted to instruct the assessors to take the Valuation of Personal Property the present year.
- Art. 15th Voted to pass over.
- Art. 16th Voted to instruct the Selectmen to cause the Receipts & Expenditures of the town the present year to be printed.
