Polls to be opened at half past one o'clock P.M.

And you are furthermore required to notify the inhabitants of said town Qualified to Vote in town affairs to meet at the above named time and place to act on the following articles viz.

Art. 1st To choose a Moderator.

Art. 2^d To see what measures the town will take to celebrate the completion of the Adairworth Monument to do or act on said subject as the town may Judge best.

Art. 3^d To hear and act on all Reports.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at the townhouse and each of the public meetinghouses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
