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To Samuel S. Jones Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections and town affairs to meet at the town Hall in said town on Monday the eighth day of November next it being the second Monday of said month at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes for a Governor, and Lieut. Governor of this Commonwealth and six Senators for the District of Middlesex all on one ballot.

Also to choose a Representative to represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of January next.

Likewise to bring in to the Selectmen on a separate ballot their Votes for a Representative in the thirty second Congress of the United States of America for district Number Four to fill the vacancy occasioned by the Death of the Hon. Benjamin Thompson for the residue of the term for which said Thompson was chosen.

And also to bring in on a separate ballot their Votes for one Representative to represent them in the thirty third Congress of the United States of America for District Number Eight for the term of two years from the fourth day of March 1853. all the aforesaid ballots to be brought in in one sealed Envelope.

Likewise to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes upon the following Question viz. "Is it expedient that delegates should be chosen to meet in Convention for the purpose of revising or altering the Constitution of Government of this Commonwealth."
