Art. 1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator

Art. 2^d The Chairman of the Selectmen read a letter from Council in reference to the decision of the School house case. It was then voted to instruct the Selectmen to provide a suitable place for the Winter school.

Voted to instruct the Selectmen to confer with the First Parish and ascertain on what conditions the school house can be bought and remain where it now stands, and report at March Meeting.

Voted to instruct the Selectmen to hire the School house for the Winter school if it can be obtained for a reasonable price if not to hire one of the Westups.

Art. 3^d Voted to give the Sudbury Brass Band the free use of the Town Hall for the purposes expressed in this article.
