Art. 3^d To see what measures the town will take to provide a school house for the Centre District to do or act in reference to a school house for said District as the town may think proper.

Art. 4th To hear and act on all Reports.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

And if you fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doing thereon to the town Clerk at or before the time of Meeting as aforesaid.
