At a Legal Meeting of the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the sixth day of December A.D. 1852 the articles in the preceding Warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows. Viz.

Art. 1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator

Art. 2^d The Selectmen Reported Verbally, that they had not procured a place for the Winter School.

Art. 3^d Voted to pay the First Parish the sum of four hundred dollars for the School house if it could be purchased for that sum.

The First Parish through their Committee made the following proposals viz. That they would sell to the Town their School house with all the fixtures belonging to the same for the sum of five hundred dollars, said house to be removed within one year from this date.

Voted to accept of said proposal. It was then Voted to Instruct the Selectmen to give their Votes in behalf of the Town for the sum of five hundred dollars, on receipt of a title to said School house.

Art. 4th Voted to pass over.
