To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are required to notify the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote at Elections to meet at the town Hall in said town on Monday the seventh day of March next at ten of the Clock in the forenoon precisely to Choose a Delegate to meet in Convention at the State House in Boston on the first Wednesday of May next for the purpose of Revising or Altering the Constitution of Government of this Commonwealth agreeable to an act passed on the seventh day of May in the year eighteen hundred and fifty two.

Ballot for a Delegate to be brought in in a Sealed Envelope
Polls to be opened at halfpast ten O'Clock A.M.

And you are furthermore required to notify the inhabitants of said Sudbury Qualified to Vote at Elections and in town affairs to meet at the above named time and place then and there to act on the following articles viz.

Art. 1st To Choose a Moderator

Art. 2^d To bring in their Votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.

Art. 3^d To choose all necessary town officers for the Year ensuing.

Art. 4th To determine the manner of repairing Highways, Townways, and Bridges the Year ensuing and grant money for the same.

Art. 5th To hear and act on all Reports and pass any Votes relative to said that the town may think proper.

Art. 6th To see if the town will give the free use of the town hall for Lyceums the past Winter and untill the first of April next to do or act as the town shall think best.

Art. 7th To hear the Report of the Wadsworth Monument Committee and act thereon, and also to see what measures the town will take to finish the grading around said monument. — And likewise the building the Road to the same and fencing said ground, to do or act on said subjects as the town may think best.
