At a Legal meeting of the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections held on Monday the seventh day of March A.D. 1853. it being the first Monday of said month for the purpose of choosing a Delegate to meet in Convention at the State House in Boston on the first Wednesday of May next for the purpose of Revising or Altering the Constitution of Government of this Commonwealth gave in their Votes as follows.

Whole number of Ballots one hundred ninety two

Necessary to a choice ninety seven

Moses C. Hurlbut one hundred twelve

Nahum Thompson sixty

Jona. R. Rose nineteen

Scattering one. — And Moses C. Hurlbut is chosen

with Envelopes 143 without 49

The articles in the preceding Warrant were then taken up and acted upon as follows

Art. 1st Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator

Art. 2^d Gave in their Votes for County Treasurer as follows

Whole number of Ballots one hundred fifty three

For Steadman Buttrick one hundred fifty three

Art. 3^d Chose the following Town Officers

Town Clerk — Ephraim Stone. Qualified in open Meeting by the Moderator

Selectmen — Abel B. Jones Loring Wheeler

It was then Voted that the Meeting be adjourned to tomorrow at ten of the Clock A.M.

March 8. 1853 Met agreeable to adjournment and chose for 3^d Selectman — Leander Haynes

Assessors — Samuel A. Jones Elisha W. Haynes & Jonas S. Hunt
Overseers of the Poor — Charles Garry, George W. Moore, and Reuben S. Willis.

Treasurer — Nahum Thompson

School Committee. — Voted to choose a Committee of five to constitute an Examining and Prudential School Committee.
