To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the Town of
Sudbury in said County Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote at Elections and in town affairs to meet at the town hall in said town on Monday the fourth day of April next at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles viz.

Art. 1st To bring in to the Selectmen their Votes on one Ballot for
three County Commissioners, and also their Votes on one
ballot for two Special County Commissioners for the County
of Middlesex.

Art. 2^d To Choose a Moderator

Art. 3^d To fill all vacancies that may occur in town offices by reason of non-acceptance or resignation

Art. 4th To hear and act on all Reports and pass any Votes relative to the same that the town may Judge best.

Art. 5th To Grant money for all necessary purposes for the Year ensuing

Art. 6th To determine the manner of Collecting the Taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of said town the present Year and agree with some suitable person to collect the same.

Art 7th To see the Town will order the Receipts and Expenditures for the ensuing year to be printed for the use of the town.

Art. 8th To see if the Town will discount certain Taxes that may offered for that purpose.

Art 9.th To see if the Town will instruct the assessors to take the valuation of Personal Property the present year.

Art. 10th To see if the Town will give the Selectmen further instructions in reference to finishing the Room under the Town Hall to do or act in reference to said subject as the town may Judge best.
