To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town of
Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury Qualified to Vote in Elections and in town affairs to meet at the "Town Hall" in said town on Monday the sixth day of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following articles Viz.

1. To Choose a Moderator
2. To bring in their Votes for a County Treasurer for the County of Middlesex.
3. To Choose all necessary Town officers for the Year ensuing.
4. To determine the manner of repairing Highways Townways and Bridges the Year ensuing and grant money for the same.
5. To hear and act on all Reports and pass any Votes relative to said reports that the town may think proper.
6. To see if the town will accept of certain Books presented to the town by Henry Plympton Esq. of Boston and what disposal shall be made of the same if accepted.
7. To see if the town will take any measures to preserve their School District Libraries to do or act any way on the subject that the town shall think best.
8. To see if the town will build a Fence in front of the Centre School house to do or act as the town may think proper.
9. To see if the town will discontinue a piece of Highway near the house of Adam N. Smith to do or act as the town shall think best

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested Copy thereof at the Townhouse and each of the public meetinghouses in said town two sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
