In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are
required to notify the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified
to vote in town affairs to meet at the town Hall in said town
on Monday the eighteenth day of September current at two of the
clock in the afternoon precisely then and there to act on the
following articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator

2. To see if the town will choose a Committee to defend a suit
brought against said town by Nathaniel J. Wyeth to do or act
any way in reference to said subject that the town shall
think best.

And You are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up
an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the public
meetinghouses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the
time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with Your
doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as
aforesaid.

Year of our Lord eighteen hundred and fifty four.
