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At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury held on Monday the eighteenth day of September A.D. 1854. the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows.

Viz.

1. Chose James Moore Moderator.

2. Voted to choose a Committee of two to investigate the subject referred to in this article with discretionary power to settle the same or defend the suit to final judgment.

Whom Abel B. Jones and Samuel A. Jones Committee.

To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town  
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are required to notify the Inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to vote in Elections to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the thirteenth day of November next it being the second Monday of said month at nine of the Clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their votes for a Governor, and Lieut. Governor of this Commonwealth, and six Senators for the District of Middlesex all on one ballot.

Also to bring in to the Selectmen on a separate ballot their votes for a Representative to Represent them in the thirty fourth Congress of the United States of America for District No. eight for the term of two Years from the fourth day of March 1855.

Like wise to bring in to the Selectmen on a separate ballot their votes for a County Commissioner for the County of Middlesex agreeable to an act passed March 11. 1854.
