4. Voted to Grant the sum of twelve hundred and fifty dollars for repairing Highways Townways and Bridges the ensuing Year and that said sum be expended in the same manner as in the Year 1853. And that the price of Labor be twelve and one half cents per hour.

Voted that so much of the Grant for Highways of last Year as is not distributed to the Surveyors be expended under the direction of the Selectmen to Repair the Bridges — Voted that the Selectmen appoint Highway Surveyors in the several Wards.
