To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town
of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are
required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified
to vote in town affairs to meet at the town Hall in said town
on Monday the second day of April next at ten of the clock in
the forenoon precisely then and there to act on the following
articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator
2. To fill all vacancies that may occur in town offices by reason
of non acceptance or resignation.
3. To hear and act on all Reports and pass any votes relative to
the same that the town may judge best.
4. To Grant Money for all necessary purposes for the Year ensuing.
5. To determine the manner of Collecting the Taxes that may be
assessed upon the inhabitants of said town the present Year
and agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
6. To see for what purposes and on what Conditions the town will allow
the "Town Hall" to be used the ensuing Year to do or act as the town
shall think best.
7. To see if the town will order the Receipts and Expenditures printed
for the Year ensuing.
8. To see if the town will instruct the Assessors to take the
Valuation of Personal Property the present Year.
9. To see if the Town will accept of a list of Jurors as made out
by the Selectmen.
10. To see if the town will authorize and empower the Collector of
Taxes for the Year 1854. to use any and all means of Collecting the Taxes
committed to him to collect which may now be lawfully used by town
Treasurers when acting as Collectors.
11. To see if the town will revoke all former by laws rules and
regulations respecting the School Libraries and order said
Libraries to be collected and deposited in the Centre district
and establish such Rules and Regulations as the town may
think best provided a suitable place can be procured to do or
act in reference to said subject as the town may think best.
