To Samuel A. Jones Constable of the town of Sudbury
in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are required
to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury Qualified to vote in town
affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the sixteenth
day of April current at one of the Clock in the afternoon precisely then
and there to act on the following articles viz.

1. To choose a Moderator.
2. To see if the town will take measures to establish a High School,
to new District the town, or to divide any of the present Districts
to do or act as the town may think proper.
3. To see if the town will take measures to erect new School houses
or provide other means to accommodate new Schools, to do or act
as the town may think proper.
4. To see if the town will take measures to transplant ornamental and
shade trees around the Wadsworth Monument, to do or act as the
town may judge best.
5. To see if the town will choose a Committee to let out the Repairing
of the Bridges and Sluices as reported by the Selectmen to do or
act as the town may think best.
6. To see if the town will authorize and empower the Collector of Taxes
for the Year 1855, to use any and all means of Collecting the Taxes
committed to him to collect which may now be lawfully used by
town Treasurers when acting as collectors.
7. To choose all necessary Town Officers not chosen at March Meeting.
8. To see if the town will let out the taking care of the town Hall to some
suitable person the Year ensuing, to do or act as they shall think best.

And You are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested
copy thereof at the town house and each of the Public Meeting houses in said town
two Sabbath at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with Your doings
thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
