At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs held on Monday April the sixteenth A.D. 1855, the articles in the preceding Warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows viz.

1. Chose Capt. James Moore Moderator.
2. Voted to pass so much of this article as has reference to a High School.
It was then voted that the remainder of this article be submitted to a select committee of ten, two in each School District to investigate the subject of said article and Report at a future meeting for the consideration of the town Chose Drury Fairbank, S. A. Jones, J. B. Battles, B. H. Richardson, E. Moore, J. H. Dakin, N. Thompson, L. Wheeler, Amory Maynard, Lewis Brigham said Committee.
3. Voted that the subject matter of this article be submitted to the Committee chosen under the 2nd Article.
4. Voted to instruct the Selectmen to plant such Trees as they shall think necessary around the Monument and on the avenue leading to the same, said trees to be set at a distance of not more than thirty feet apart.
5. Voted that the Selectmen be said Committee.
6. Voted to authorize and empower the Collector for the Year 1855, to use the same means to collect Taxes that may be lawfully used by a Treasurer when acting as collector.
7. Chose Lyman Howe and Thomas P. Hurlbut Examining School Committee in place of Linus H. Shaw & Charles W. Spear who declined serving. Poured Keeper Jonas Tower.
Measurers of Wood & Surveyors of Lumber. Nahum Thompson, Ephraim Moore, Arthur Bower, Wm Maynard, S. W. Balcom, Levi S. Jones, Webster Moore, Benj. H. Richardson, Asahel Haynes, Sealer of Weights & Measures Levi S. Jones.
Voted that the Sexton business be let out by the Selectmen.
