of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts You are required to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections to meet at the town Hall in said town on Tuesday the sixth day of November next being the Tuesday after the first Monday in said Month at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes for a Governor, Lieut. Governor, Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver General, Auditor of Accounts, and Attorney General of this Commonwealth and six Senators for the District of Middlesex, all on one Ballot.

Also to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes on a Separate ballot for a County Treasurer and a County Commissioners for the County of Middlesex and a Register of Deeds for the Southern District of Middlesex.

Likewise to choose a Representative to represent said town in the General Court of this Commonwealth to be convened on the first Wednesday of January next.
