And You are also required to notify the inhabitants of said town qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the above named time and place then and there to act on the following articles viz.

1. To Choose a Moderator
2. To see if the town will accept of a Report of the Selectmen in favor of discontinuing a piece of Town Road near the house of Adam N. Smith.
3. To see if the town will allow George Barker further compensation for work done to the town Hall, to do or act as the town shall think best.
4. To see if the town will give the inhabitants the free use of the Town Hall Warm and Light the same for Military and Lyceum purposes and other social meetings untill the first day of March next, to do or act as the town may judge best.
5. To hear and act on all Reports and pass any votes in reference to the same as the town shall think best.

And You are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the Town house and each of the public Meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with Your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
