And You are also required to notify the inhabitants of said town qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the above named time and place then and there to act on the following articles viz,

1. To Choose a Moderator
2. To see if the town will accept certain Books presented to the town of Sudbury for the use of the District Schools by Henry Plympton Esqr. of Boston to take such action concerning said books as to the town may seem most proper,
3. To see if the town will procure a Lantern to be placed in front of their Town House, to do or act as they shall think best,
4. To see if the town will authorize and empower the Collector of Taxes for the Year 1856, to use any and all means of collecting the Taxes committed to him to collect which may now be lawfully used when the town Treasurer is acting as Collector,

And You are directed to serve this Warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and each of the Public meeting houses in said town two Sabbaths at least before the time set for holding said meeting Hereof fail not and make return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to ourselves at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
