Middlesex: SS:

To Webster Moore, Constable of Sudbury,
in said County, Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said town, on Monday the second day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, precisely, then and there to act on the following articles, viz:

Art: 1st To choose a Moderator

Art: 2nd To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Art: 3rd To determine the manner of repairing highways, town ways, and Bridges the year ensuing, and grant a suitable sum of money for the same

Art: 4th To hear and act on all reports, and pass any votes relative to said reports that the town think best.

Art: 5th To see if the town will authorize their Assessors to apportion to the Warden all the road joining their farm, and so much in addition as lies between the corner near Widow David Haynes' or to do or act as the town think best.

Art: 6th To see if the town will procure a suitable place to bury their dead, or to do or act in reference to the place as the town think best.

Art: 7th To see if the town will build a school house in the North West District, or to do or act in reference to said district and school house as the town think best.

Art: 8th To see if the town will give the school committee any instructions with regard to the course they shall take to discover and punish the perpetrators of damage in and upon the school house in the Centre district. And to see if the town will choose a committee to draft rules and regulations for the government of the scholars while in and around the public school houses, and instruct said committee to report at April meeting, or to do or act as the town think best.

Art: 9th To see if the town will repair or rebuild the Canal Bridge or do or act as the town think best.—
