To Reuben M. Moore, Constable of the town of
Sudbury, in said County — Greeling.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Sudbury qualified to vote in Elections and in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the sixth day of April next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, precisely, then and there to act on the following Articles, viz:

- Article 1. To Choose a Moderator to preside over said meeting.
- " 2 To Choose all necessary town officers not chosen at March meeting and fill all vacancies occasioned by resignation or otherwise
- " 3 To hear and act on all reports, which may be presented, and pass any votes relative to said reports that the town may think proper
- " 4 To grant money for all necessary ^{town} purposes for the year ensuing
- " 5 To determine the manner of collecting the taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of said town the present year and agree with some suitable person to collect the same
- " 7 To see if the town will accept of the list of jurors, as made out by the select men, to do or act as the town thinks best.
- " 6 To see if the town will choose a committee to make the distribution of the interest arising from the "Elisha Goodnow Fund"
- " 8 To see for what purposes and on what conditions the town will allow the Town Hall to be used the ensuing year, to do or act as the town thinks best
- " 9 To see if the town will divide the Highway ward of which Albert Larkin is surveyor.
- " 10 To see if the town will give the Overseers of the Poor, any instructions concerning the case of Joseph Garfield, to do or act as the town may think best
- " 11 To see if the town will procure runners for their house to do or act &c
