For Schools— Eleven hundred and thirty dollars
For Fuel One hundred and twenty dollars
(with the understanding that if this sum is not sufficient
for this purpose, the deficiency be made up out of the grant for Schools)
For Incidentals, Four hundred dollars
Interest on Elisha Goodnow Fund, Sixty dollars—
To pay Treasurer, Ten dollars—
For taking care of Armay, Thirty dollars
" Support of Poor, One thousand dollars
" School house at Assabet, One thousand dollars
" New Burying Ground, Two hundred dollars
To pay accounts (allowed), Two hundred and three dollars $\frac{63}{100}$
" for Repairing Canal Bridge, Seventy five dollars

Art 5- Voted that the taxes be made payable as follows, viz:

All single Poll Taxes payable on demand. All other
taxes payable in three equal installments as follows, viz:

The first installment on the first day of September

The second on the first day of November

The third on the first day of February

And the Collector shall pay over to the Treasurer

each installment in full either in money or by
his note as follows, viz the first payment on or before

the tenth day of Sept: the second on or before the tenth

day of Nov: the third on or before the tenth day of February

And in default of payment of any one installment to the

Treasurer, the Collector shall forfeit his per cent for
collecting on said installment.

Voted to let out the collecting of taxes to the lowest Bidder.

And Edwin A Gerry agrees to collect them for twenty seven

Cents on the hundred dollars

Art 6 Voted that the Select Men take charge of the distribution

of that part of the interest of the "Elisha Goodnow Fund"

relating to the industrious poor, and that the School

Committee take charge of that part relating to books

for scholars &c
