Art 8. Voted that the town Hall be opened and used on the following conditions viz: for all town meetings, meetings of committees doing business for the town, Selectmen's meetings, Assessors meetings and all Political Conferences, free, and for all other purposes for which the inhabitants of the town may wish to use the town house, they shall pay the expense of lighting, warming and taking care of the house during the time they occupy the same. And all persons who may want the house for any purpose for which they shall sell tickets for admission, shall pay a reasonable sum for the use of the house. — the price to be fixed by the Select men.

Voted that the taking care of the town house for all purposes be let out to the lowest bidder, the person taking care of the house to open, light, and warm the same when necessary, be present at all times when the house is occupied, sweep the house and keep it clean and in good order, wash the floors when necessary, close and fasten the doors & Blinds when the house is not occupied, ring the bell at all times when necessary; saw and split the wood and put the same in the wood closets, shovel a path when there is snow, from the road to the front door, of sufficient width for two persons; and if any lamps or other furniture belonging to the said house be broken or in any way damaged through the fault or neglect of the person taking care of the same, he shall make the same good without charge to the town.
