To Reuben M. Moore, one of the Constables of
the Town of Sudbury in said County.

Greeting;

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you
are hereby required to notify, and warn the inhabitants
of said Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in town
affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Monday
the eighth day of June next, at one of the clock in the
afternoon, to act upon the following articles viz:

Art 1 To Chose a Moderator to preside over said meeting

Art 2. To see if the Town will instruct the Overseers of the
Poor to rebuild the barn on the Poor Farm; to do or
act in reference to said Poor Farm and Paupers as
the Town may think proper

Art 3. To see if the Town will build a tomb to be used for
the benefit of the Town, to do or act as the Town
may think Proper.

Art 4 To hear and act on all reports which may be
presented, and pass any votes relative to the same that
the Town may think proper.

Art 5th To see if the Town will instruct the Selectmen to
draw upon the Treasurer for money now in his hands
to pay bills upon which ^{interest} is arising.

Art 6 To see if the Town will take any measures to have
their Buildings insured.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an
attested copy thereof at each of the public meeting houses and at the
Town House in said town, seven days at least before the time
for holding said meeting

Hereof fail not and make return
of this warrant with your doing thereon to the Town Clerk
at the time and place of said meeting
