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Middlesex. S.S.

To John W. Rice one of the constables of the town of Guelbury in said County. Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Guelbury, qualified to vote in town affairs to assemble in the Town Hall in said town on Monday the seventeenth day of August, instant, at four o'clock, in the afternoon, precisely, then and there to act on the following Articles, viz:

- Art 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting
- Art 2^d To see if the town will accept of certain alterations made in a town way at Assabet by the Selectmen on petition of Phineas Puffer & others.
- Art 3 To see if the town will accept of a private way laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Jonathan P. Fairbanks & Andrew Hunt, also a private laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Newell Bent; likewise a private way laid out by the Selectmen on petition of Wm. Maynard.
- Art 4 To see what measures, if any, the town will take in regard to laying out & fencing the new Burying ground
- Art 5 To see if the town will discontinue a piece of public Highway near Landham Schoolhouse.

And you are required to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the town house and at each of the public meeting houses in said town seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting. Hereof fail not and make return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the town Clerk, on or before the time appointed for holding said meeting.
