Sudbury 1 August 17th 1857
Pursuant to the within warrant to me directed, I have notified and warned the inhabitants of said town of Sudbury qualified as therein expressed to assemble at the Town Hall in said town on Monday the seventeenth day of August instant at four o'clock in the afternoon precisely by posting up an attested copy at the Town House, and each of the public Meeting houses in said town, seven days at least before the time of holding said meeting.

At a legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury held in the Town Hall on Monday, August 17th A.D. 1857, the articles in the preceding warrant were taken up and acted upon as follows: viz:

Article 1st Chose Capt. Abel B. Jones. Moderator

Art. 2^d Voted to accept of the report of the doings of the Selectmen

Art. 3^d Voted to accept of the report of the doings of the Selectmen.

Art. 4th Voted to instruct the Selectmen to lay out the New Burying Ground, and cause it to be fenced as they think proper.

Art. 5 Voted to discontinue so much of the road referred to in this article, as lies outside of the line of the new road adjoining.

Then voted to dissolve this meeting.
