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Middlesex, S.S. to John W. Rice, a Constable of the
Town of Sudbury, in said County, Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts,
you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants
of the town of Sudbury, qualified as the Constitution re-
quires to assemble at the Town Hall, on Tuesday, the
third day of November next, it being the Tuesday
next after the first Monday in said month, in the
year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Seven
at ten of the clock in the forenoon precisely, to give in
to the selectmen, their votes for a Governor, Lieut.
Governor, Councillor for District No. 6, Secretary,
Treasurer and Receiver General, Attorney General,
Auditor of Accounts, for this Commonwealth, a Sen-
ator for the Third Middlesex^{Senatorial} District, all on one
Ballot, also, to give in their votes for a Representative
to the next General Court, for District No. 16 on a
separate Ballot, Likewise to give in their vote for
a county Commissioner, for the County Middlesex,
on a separate Ballot

All the foregoing Ballots to be deposited at one checking
Polls to be opened at 10 o'clock A.M.

And you are also required to notify and warn
the inhabitants of said town of Sudbury, qualified
to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town
Hall in said town on Tuesday, the third day of
November next at 1 o'clock in the afternoon
to act upon the following Subjects, viz:

Art. 1st To Choose a Moderator to preside in said
Meeting

Art. 2nd, To see if the town will take measures
to establish the limits of Assabet School
District, and also choose some person to
take charge of the School House, in said
District
