Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in elections and in town affairs, to assemble in the town hall in said Sudbury, on Monday the first day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, precisely then and there to act on the following Articles: Viz:

- Art. 1 To choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting
- Art. 2 To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing
- Art. 3 To hear reports and act thereon
- Art. 4 To determine the manner of repairing highways, townways and bridges, the ensuing year and to grant money, to carry the same into effect
- Art. 5 To see if the town will authorize their Assessors to apportion, to the Warden of their Poor establishment, all the road adjoining their farm, to keep in repair the ensuing year, to do or act as the town may think proper
- Art. 6 To see if the town, will sell lots in their New Burying Ground, to do or act, in reference to said Burying Ground as the town may think proper
- Art. 7 To see if the town will instruct their Select men, to draw an order on the Treasurer for the wages of the teacher in the Centre school for the winter term of 1857 & '58.
