To Webster Moore a Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to assemble in the Town Hall in said town on Monday the fifth day of April next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, viz.

- Art. 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting
- Art. 2^d To choose all necessary town officers not chosen at the March meeting, and fill all vacancies occasioned by non acceptance or otherwise.
- Art. 3^d To hear and act on reports
- Art. 4th To Grant money for all necessary town purposes for the year ensuing
- Art. 5th To determine the manner of collecting the taxes that may be assessed upon the inhabitants of said town the present year, and agree with some suitable person to collect the same.
- Art. 6th To see if the town will accept of a list of jurors as made out by the selectmen to do or act as the town thinks best
- Art. 7th To see if the town will rebuild a stone bridge near the foot of Green Hill to do or act as the town may think proper
- Art. 8th To see if the town will give their school committee leave to rearrange the desks and chairs in the school houses to do or act as the town may think proper
