Art. 12 Voted to lend to the Town of Wayland any of the Books of Records, on these conditions, viz: that but one book shall be taken at a time, that said book shall be kept in the town's safe at Wayland at all times when not in use, and shall be returned within a reasonable time not exceeding three months.

Art. 13 Voted to pass over this Article.

Art. 14 Voted that the town hall may be used for the same purposes and on the same conditions as last year with the following additions, viz: that the hall shall be opened, warmed, lighted and used, free for a singing school and Lyceum, provided said singing school and Lyceum shall be free for all the inhabitants of the town to attend.

Voted to let out the taking care of the town house to the lowest bidder on the same conditions as last year, and the same was let out to James J. Puffer for thirty-eight dollars.

Art. 15 Voted to instruct the Selectmen to procure gravel for the several highway wards wherever it is needed.

Art. 16 Voted to Grant the sum of thirty dollars ^{to pay} for taking care of the Armory the present year.

Art. 17 Voted to pass over this Article.

Art. 18 Voted to instruct the Overseers of the Poor to divide & keep in ^{repair} the fence between their Poor farm and land owned by Joel Parmenter.

Art. 19 Voted not to build a receiving tomb.

Then Voted to dissolve this meeting.
