In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are hereby required to notify and warn the
inhabitants of said town of Sudbury, qualified
to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town
Call in said town on Monday the thirtieth
day of August, inst. at two of the clock in
the afternoon to act upon the following Subject, viz

Art 1st To Choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

Art 2^d To see if the Town will take into consideration
the subject of the straightenings and alterations in
the Highway, petitioned for by Cyrus Hunt & others;
to do or act in reference to said subject as the
Town may think proper.

Art 3^d To See if the Town will instruct the Selectmen
to print the receipts and expenditures of the
Town for the present year.

Art 4 To Hear and act on reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting
up an attested, printed copy thereof at the Town House,
at each of the public meeting houses in said town, and
at J. A. Prouty's Store in Assabet, two sabbaths at least
before the time appointed for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this war-
rant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or
before the time appointed for said meeting.
