To Webster Moore & John W. Rice. Constables of the Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble in the town hall in said town of Sudbury on Monday the eleventh day of October, inst at one of the clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following subjects, viz.

- Art 1 To Choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting
- Art 2 To see if the town will order the Canal Bridge to be opened for public travel, to do or act in reference to said bridge as the town may think proper.
- Art 3 To Hear and act on reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up attested printed copies thereof at the Town House, at each of the public meeting-houses, and at J. H. Prouty's store in Assabet and also by serving the legal of said town of Sudbury with a printed copy of this Warrant at their several places of abode on or before Saturday the ninth day of October instant at Twelve o'clock Meridian

Hereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk on or before the time appointed for holding said meeting
