To Webster Moore a Constable
of the town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of
Massachusetts you are hereby required to
notify and warn the inhabitants of said
town of Sudbury qualified as the Constitution
requires to vote in Elections to assemble at the
town hall in said town of Sudbury on Tuesday
the second day of November next it being the
Tuesday next after the first Monday in said
Month, in the year one thousand eight hundred and
fifty eight, at ten of the clock in the forenoon
precisely to bring in to the select men their
Votes for Governor, Lieut. Governor, Councillor
for the sixth councillor District, Secretary, Treas-
urer & Receiver General, Attorney General, Auditor,
for this Commonwealth, a Senator for the Third
Middlesex District, all on one Ballot.

Likewise to bring in to the Selectmen their
votes for a Representative to the thirty sixth
Congress of the United States for District num-
ber eight on a Separate Ballot. Likewise
to bring in to the Select men their votes for
a Representative to the General Court of
Massachusetts for the sixteenth Middlesex
Representative District, to convene in Boston
on the first Wednesday of January, next, on
a separate ballot. Likewise to bring in
to the Selectmen their votes for a County
Treasurer, a County Commissioner, a Register
of Deeds for the southern District, and a
Register of Probate and Insolvency, for the
County of Middlesex on a separate Ballot,
All the foregoing ballots to be deposited at
one Checking.
