To Webster Moore a Constable of
the Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the town Hall in said town on Thursday the tenth day of February, inst at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act on the following subjects:

Art 1 To choose a Moderator to Preside in said meeting

Art 2 To see if the Town will petition the Legislature to remove or cause to be removed, the "Middlesex Canal Dam" erected across Concord River in Billerica, or such part thereof, as the Legislature shall deem expedient and just, for the purpose of reclaiming the Meadow Land, bordering upon Sudbury and Concord Rivers. Or do or act in any way relative thereto when met.

Art 3 To hear and act on reports

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested, printed copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the public meeting houses in said town and at J. A. Prouty's store in Assabett, seven days, at least before the time appointed for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time for holding said meeting.
