To Edwin A. Gerry, a Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants
of the town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in Elections, to
assemble at the Town Hall, in said town, on Tuesday,
the eighth day of November next, being the Tuesday next
after the first Monday in said month, at nine of the clock
in the forenoon, to bring in to the Selectmen their Votes
For Governor; Lieut. Governor; Secretary; Treasurer and
Receiver General; Attorney General, and Auditor of
Accounts for this Commonwealth; a Councillor for
the sixth Councillor District; a Senator for the third
Middlesex District; a District Attorney, Sheriff, ^{three} Commis-
sioners of Insolvency, a County Commissioner, ^{two special} and a
Clerk of Courts, for the County of Middlesex, all one
one ballot.

Likewise, to bring in to the Selectmen, their
votes for a Representative to the General Court of Massa-
chusetts, for the Sixteenth Middlesex District on a
separate ballot. All the foregoing ballots to be
deposited at one checking.

Polls to be opened at a quarter before ten o'clock, A.M.

And you are also required to notify and warn
the Inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to
vote in town affairs, to assemble in the Town Hall
in said Town, on Tuesday, the eighth day of November
next, at one of the clock in the afternoon, then and
there to act on the following, subjects Viz:

Art. 1. To Choose a Moderator to preside in said Meeting

Art. 2. To see if the Town will refund to those persons
who have had their Dogs licensed the present year
