The Report of the Trustees of the "Donation Fund" for the benefit of the industrious poor was read & accepted.

The Report of the committee ^{chosen} in April last to make the distribution of the interest arising from the "Elisha Goodnow Fund" was read by the Committee and accepted by the Town.

The Report of the Trustees of the "Jerusha Howe Fund" was read and accepted by the Town.

The Report of the Overseers of the Poor was read and accepted by the Town.

The above Report shows the total amount of expenditures for the support of the Poor during the year ending

March 5th 1860, including all out of Town bills, the pay of the Warden and Overseers for services, and the pay of hired help: to have been \$1615.84

The Total amount of Receipts including the Town Grant and money received

from the sale of wood and Lumber — 1221.49

Leaving a Balance against the Town of \$ 394.35

The Overseers of the Poor, in their Report, recommend to the Town to order the Treasurer to furnish money to pay the balance against the town so that next Board of Overseers will have no debts on their hands.
