To Samuel A. Jones, a Constable of the  
Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in Town affairs, to assemble at the Town Hall, in said Town, on Monday the 2<sup>d</sup> day of April next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following Articles:

- Art 1<sup>st</sup> To Choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.
- Art 2<sup>d</sup> To Choose all necessary Town officers not chosen at March meeting and fill all vacancies which may have occurred by resignation or otherwise.
- Art 3<sup>d</sup> To see if the Town will order the Overseers of the Poor to build one half of the fence between the Town Farm and land of Benben S. Willis, to do or act as the Town may think proper
- Art 4 To see if the Town will pay for ringing the Bell in the centre of the Town daily, and specify at what hours, - to do or act &c
- Art 5 To see if the Town will pay for taking care of the Armory in said town, to do or act, &c
- Art 6 To see if the Town will allow the Union Library Association in the North East District to take their share of the books in the District Libraries.
- Art 7 To see if the Town will paint the fences around the Wadsworth Monument, to do or act &c
