The votes upon the foregoing articles are to be upon one ballot, and in substance as follows to wit: Amendments, Article first—Yes, or No. Article Second—Yes, or No.

And you are also required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to assemble at the Town Hall in said Town on Monday the seventh day of May next at two of the Clock in the afternoon, then and there to act upon the following Articles.—

- Art 1st To Choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting
- Art 2^d To see if the Town will sell their district libraries to do or act as the town may think proper.
- Art 3^d To see if the town will order, how the money appropriated for schools the current year, shall be distributed, to do &c
- Art 4th To see if the town will allow their school houses to be used for any other purposes than for schools, to do, &c
- Art 5 To see if the town will allow the Weedsworth R. R. any part of the money which the town drew from the State, to do &c
- Art 6 To see if the town will repair or rebuild the bridge across "Wash Brook," so called near Asahel Haynes' Mill, to do &c
- Art 7 To see if the Town will authorize their Selectmen to borrow money to pay Current expenses and bills already due, to meet which there is no money in the treasury.
- Art 8 To see if the Town will furnish all the school books required by the pupils in their public schools, for which the ^{interest upon} fund is insufficient to pay, appropriate money therefor, and make
