

money to pay current expenses and bills already due to meet which there is no money in the treasury.

Art 8th Passed over the first part of this article, and voted that school books be furnished free of charge from the interest arising upon the Elisha Goodnow fund, to those pupils only whose parents or guardians are unable to furnish them, and that the surplus, if any, be appropriated to reduce the price of school books sold to the pupils attending the public schools.

Art 9th Voted to enlarge the school house in the Centre District, by the addition of another story underneath the same, and Voted to grant the sum of \$500. to pay the expense of building and furnishing the above addition. Voted also to grant \$100. for the expenses of tuition and fuel for the Center School the coming winter in addition to the grant already made at April meeting. Then Voted to choose a committee of three to carry the above votes into effect, and chose Aaron Hunt, Charles Gury and Charles Thompson for said committee. Voted also to leave the matter of furnishing seats for the above addition to the above committee.

Voted also that the division of the school in said district be left to the Sch. Committee.

Art 10 Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell the old hearse, and also sundry old gates and other articles in the hearse house, at auction immediately after the close of this meeting.

Art 11 Voted to choose a committee of one person to examine the road leading to the house of Wheeler Moore and report the same to the town at some future meeting, and chose Capt Reuben S. Willis for said committee.
