Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts,  
you are required to notify and warn the inhabit-  
ants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in  
elections, to meet at the Town Hall in said  
Sudbury, on Tuesday, the sixth day of November  
next, it being the next Tuesday after the first  
Monday of said month at ten of the clock in  
the forenoon, to bring in their votes to the  
selectmen for a Governor, Lieutenant Governor,  
Secretary, Treasurer and Receiver General,  
Auditor of Accounts, and Attorney General, for  
this Commonwealth, a Councillor for District  
No. six, and a Senator for District No. Three,  
all upon one ballot.

Also, to bring in their votes for thirteen Electors  
of President and Vice President of the United  
States, all on one ballot. Also, to give in their  
votes for a Representative in the Congress of  
the United States for District No. Eight; a  
County Commissioner, for the County of  
Middlesex, and a Representative in the next  
General Court of Massachusetts for District  
No. sixteen; upon separate ballots. All the  
foregoing ballots to be deposited at one Checking  
Polls to be opened at ten o'clock, A. M.

And you are also required to notify and  
warn the inhabitants of said Town of Sud-  
bury, qualified to vote in Town Affairs, to  
assemble at the Town Hall, in said Town,  
on Tuesday the sixth day of November next, at  
one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the fol-  
lowing articles, Viz:
