

The Overseers of the poor of Sudbury beg leave to present their annual report for the year ending March 1st, 1861.

The whole number of paupers at the Poor Farm and work house March 7th 1860, was nine—six males and three females
Whole number admitted during the past year—six.

Whole number of strangers and travellers provided with lodgings, meals, &c—95

Whole number of paupers discharged and left—seven.

Whole number remaining at the farm Mar. 1, 1861.—seven

Whole number assisted by the Overseers away from the farm and out of town—fourteen, Expense of supporting the same—\$145.48

Cash paid for Provisions, Groceries, Warden & Overseers services

Medical attendance &c, as per Bills ————— 955.71

Total amount of Expenditures ————— \$1101.19

Rec'd from Produce of the farm, Wood, Lumber &c \$884.45

" from Town Grant ————— 216.74

Total amount of receipts from all sources \$1101.19

Leaving in the Treasurers hands, of the Town Grant unexpended the sum of \$283.26
