Art 8 occupied, excepting at meetings of town officers and committees when his presence is not required by the selectmen. — Close and fasten the doors, windows, and blinds when the house is not occupied. — ring the bell when necessary. — saw and split the wood and put the same in the wood closets. — shovel a path when there is snow, of sufficient width for two persons to walk abreast. — from the road to the front door of the House, and if any lamps, settees or other furniture belonging to the house, be broken or any way damaged through the fault or neglect of the person taking care of the same, he shall make it good to the town.

The person taking care of the house shall give bonds if required by the selectmen.

Then let out the taking care of the house for one year from this date to Lemuel P. Brown for the sum of twenty dollars, said sum to be payment in full for all services.

Art. 9. Voted to have the inside of the school houses in town Grained, under the superintendence of the School Committee.

Art. 10 Voted to authorize the school committee of Assabet district to alter the arrangement of the seats and benches in the School House in his district and to build recitation seats and a platform.

Art 11 Voted to leave matter referred to in this article to the discretion of of the school Committee. Also Voted to authorize the School Committee to distribute the money granted for the support of schools as they think best.

Art 12 Voted that the Taxes be made payable in the same manner as last year, and collected in the same way. Also Voted ^{to} let out the collecting to the lowest bidder, and John Goodnow ² agreed to collect the taxes, and perform all the duties of collector for the sum of twenty-four dollars
