To Samuel A. Jones, Constable of the
town of Sudbury in said County of Middlesex.

Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury, qualified to vote in Town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, in said Sudbury, on Monday the 29th day of April, instant, at two o'clock P.M. then and there to act on the following Articles

- Art. 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting
- Art. 2^d To see if the Town will instruct the Assessors, to print the valuations and assessment of taxes the present year, to do or act as the Town may think best
- Art. 3^d To see if the Town will take any measures to provide for the soldiers, that may be called into the service of the United States, or for their families during their absence on such service to do or act on such subject as the Town may judge best.
- Art. 4th To hear and act on reports.

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting up an attested copy thereof at the Town House, at each of the public meeting houses, and at some public place in the village of Assabet in said town, two Sabbaths at least before the time for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid
