To Samuel A Jones, Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County of Middlesex

Greeting

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are directed to notify the inhabitants of the town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall in said Sudbury on Monday the nineteenth instant at at two o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following articles, Viz.

Art. 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting

Art. 2^d To hear the report of the military Committee and all others reports, and pass any votes relative, to the same that the town may judge best

Art. 3^d To see what measures the town will take to aid the families of volunteers who have enlisted into the service of the United States, agreeable to an act passed by the legislature of Mass on the twenty third day of May 1861

Art. 4th To see if the town will appropriate any unappropriated money in the Treasury to defray town expenses

And you are directed to serve this warrant by posting an attested copy of the same at the Town House, at each of the public Meeting houses, and at some public place in the Village of Needham in said town, two Sabbaths at least before the time appointed for holding said meeting

And fail not, and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time of meeting as aforesaid.
