Art 3 be agreed upon by said Selectmen or Committee without being referred back to the towns; and in case said line can be so agreed upon, to instruct said Selectmen to carry the matter before the General Court for final adjustment.

Art 4 Voted to grant the sum of twelve hundred dollars for repairs of Highways Townways and Bridges the ensuing year, to be distributed in the same manner as the year previous - that the sum of twelve and one half cents per hour be the price allowed by the Surveyors for labor on the Highways, that one sixth part of the whole tax be reserved untill winter, to be spent in breaking out roads if needed, and if the same is not needed for said purpose the Surveyors are ordered to work out the whole amount by the first day of May following.

Art 5th Voted that the Town Meetings for the ensuing year be warned by posting an attested copy of the Warrant for each meeting at the Town House, at each of the public Meeting houses in said Town and at some public place in the Village of Assabet, two Sabbaths before the time appointed for hold said meeting, - the Selectmen to have discretionary power to print or cause to be printed any of said warrants.

Art 7 Voted to authorize the Selectmen to purchase gravel in any of the highway wards, in town if in their judgement it is necessary, and for the interest of the town

Art 6 Voted to authorize the Assessors to apportion to the Warden of the Poor Establishment all the road adjoining the Poor farm, and also a certain piece of road lying between the boundary line of said farm and the limit of the High
