Number of Paupers at the Establishment Mar 5. 1861 was seven, five males & two females, - number admitted during the year, - seven; number discharged and left two, - Number remaining at the farm March 1, 1862 twelve, - average number through the year, eleven; Number assisted away from the farm and out of town, twenty three; number assisted away from the farm and in town, nine, number of strangers and travellers provided with food and lodging at the farm, one hundred and thirteen. Amount of receipts from the farm \$499.60 - from town Grant of 1860, \$283.26, - from grant of 1861, \$500.00; total amount of receipts \$1282.86, - total amount of expenditures \$1446.94; leaving a balance against the town of \$164.08
