of the Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts
you are required to notify and warn the inhab-
itants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote
in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, in
said Sudbury on Monday, the seventh day of
April next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon there
and there to act on the following articles. viz:

- Art. 1st To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting
- Art. 2^d To choose all necessary Town Officers, not chosen at
the March meeting, and fill any vacancies that
may occur by resignation or otherwise.
- Art. 3^d To grant money for all necessary Town purposes
for the year ensuing, and appropriate the same.
- Art. 4th To see if the Town will repair the wall around
the old Burying Ground, to do or act as the Town
may think best in regard to said repairs
- Art. 5th To accept of a list of jurors presented by the Selectmen.
- Art. 6th To see if the Town will pay for ringing the Bell
daily the year ensuing.
- Art. 7 To see if the Town will give the Selectmen any
instruction in reference to the enforcement of
the Day Law, to do or act as the town may think best.
- Art. 8 To see if the Town will grant money to repair the
road between the house of George W. Stone, and
the house of Jonathan Bacon, to do or act as the town
may think best
