

- Art 9 To see if the Town will accept the bequest in the first clause of the last will and testament, of John Goodnow, late of Boston, in the County of Suffolk, which is as follows: "I give, devise and bequeath unto my native town of Sudbury, in the County of Middlesex, the sum of twenty thousand dollars, to be appropriated for the purpose of purchasing and keeping in order a public library, for the benefit of the inhabitants of that town; and also choose a committee to receive and receipt for the same).
- Art 10 To see if the Town will accept the bequest and devise in the second clause of the said Will which is as follows:—"I also give, devise, and bequeath unto said Town of Sudbury three acres of land on the northerly part of the Sudbury Tavern Estate, adjoining the land of Horve Brown, beginning at the Meeting-house road, and running with equal width with Brown line, to the Brook, for the purpose of erecting thereon a suitable building for a library, and the further sum of twenty-five hundred dollars for the erection of such building; and whatever portion of said land shall not be needed for the purposes of said library building, the said Town of Sudbury shall have full power and authority to apply to any other town purposes, but without any power of alienation"; also to choose a committee to receive and receipt for the same)
- Art 11 To determine for what purposes and on what conditions the Town Hall may be used the present year, and agree with some suitable person to take care of the same)
- Art 12 To determine the manner of collecting the Taxes that may be assessed against the inhabitants the present year, and agree with some suitable person to collect the same)
