The town voted to authorize the School Committee to distribute the money granted for the support of schools, in such manner as they think proper.

The town also voted, that if the amount of money granted to pay for fuel for schools, is not sufficient for that purpose, that the deficiency shall be made up out of the money granted for support of schools, and if the amount granted for fuel is not all used for that purpose the balance remaining shall be used for the support of schools.

A communication was read by Rev. Mr Shaw from Henry Plympton Esq of Boston, concerning the wall around the old Burying ground, said Henry Plympton thereby offering to the town, the sum of fifty dollars, towards defraying the expense of repairing, re-pointing, and banking said wall, and the town voted to repair said wall in the manner proposed, - also Voted to choose a committee of three to superintend said repairs, then chose Jonathan P. Fairbank, Charles Thompson, and Nelson Fairbank, for said committee, Voted to instruct said committee to cause said work to be done in such manner as will be for the best interest of the town
