To Samuel A. Jones, a Constable of the
Town of Sudbury in said County. Greeting:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Sudbury qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Sudbury.

On Monday the fourteenth day of July next, at one o'clock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles, viz:

Art. 1st To Choose a Moderator to preside at said Meeting

Art. 2^d To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to furnish aid to the Sister of any person who may have enlisted into the service of the United States, from the Town of Sudbury and who was dependent on them for support at the time of enlistment: to do or act in any way on said subject as the town may think proper;

Art. 3^d To hear the report of the Library Committee, and act thereon; or rescind any vote or votes passed at any former meeting, respecting the bequests of the late John Goodnow, of Boston, and pass any vote relative to a plan for a Library Building as the town may think best.

Art 4th To hear and act on reports

Art. 5th To see if the town will accept of widenings and straightenings made by the Selectmen on petition of Wheeler Moore.
